

Pest Alert



Frosty Pod Rot is a disease caused by the fungus *Moniliophthora roreri*. It invades growing cocoa pods damaging them and the seeds produced.

Have you seen these symptoms on cocoa?

- Young pods show light yellow swellings and sometimes distortion. Seed mass may become soft and watery.
- Older pods show large dead tissue, dark brown spots with uneven borders. Premature ripening may occur and seeds become reddish brown.



 As the disease develops most of the dead outside tissue is covered by a thick white fungal growth.
