WHO IS AN ANIMAL HEALTH TECHNICIAN?

Animal Health Technicians, (AHT) is a group of professional health assistants who assist veterinarians in providing medical and welfare care to animals. They also conduct:

- Animal disease surveillance
- Animal identification and tractability,
- Screwworm control
- Food animal and animal product monitoring through harvesting and processing facilities
- Farm inspections



WHAT MUST I DO TO BECOME AN AHT?

Although many animal care workers receive on-the-job training, formal training is required to become an animal health technician. Individuals interested in becoming an AHT typically completes a 2 or 3 year programme at an approve Institution.



Main subjects needed are:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science subjects e.g. Biology
- Diploma in Veterinary Science or Animal Health Science

WHERE DO YOU GO TO BE QUALIFIED?

Any approved institution/school (locally or overseas) that offers courses in Animal Health Sciences or Veterinary Sciences.

OPPORTUNITIES:

Individuals may choose to upgrade to a Masters or Doctorate level or any specialized area in the field of Animal Health.
