History

- ⇒ The British alpine was first introduced to Jamaica from England around 1945-46
- ⇒ Both the British and French alpine are in Jamaica. The French alpine originated from in the Alps and the British alpine was developed in the 1900 in Great Britain.



CHARACTERISTICS

BRITISH ALPINE

- ⇒ The British alpine colour ranges from pure white, through to fawn, grey, brown, black, red, or various shadings or combinations of these colours .
- ⇒ Both sexes are generally short-haired, but bucks usually have long hair along the spine with a pronounced beard.
- ⇒ The ears of the alpine are medium size , of fine texture and erect.

FRENCH ALPINE

- ⇒ French Alpines are tall rangy and graceful and are best suited for temperate climates, they perform poorly in high humidity
- ⇒ The doe is a good milk producer, and with a milk butter fat yield of 4% on average

PERFORMANCE

⇒ The average litter size for alpine goat is 1.7, representing a strong tendency towards twins.
